Can you record your answers on the bottle themed paper found at the bottom of this document? If you are unable to print you can stick your answers to the questions on a small drinks bottle.

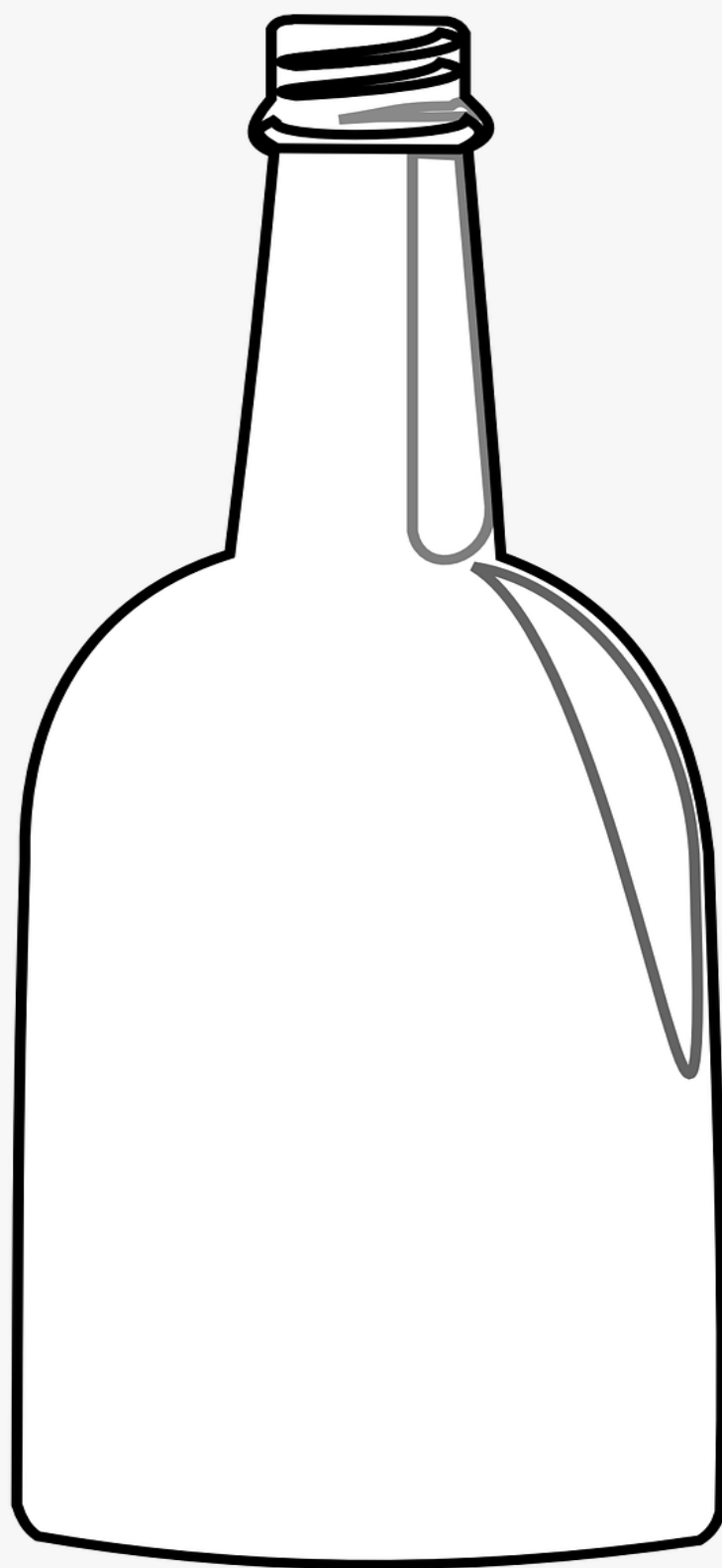
Writing Activity
