

<u>Phonics:</u>	Before you start: This is a video from YouTube with a demonstration of each sound and how we want the children to say them. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=74kirFdOaPw Listen to the jolly phonics song, encourage the children to sing along and do the actions for each letter. <i>Tuesday:</i> Phonics: new sound of the day: 16 Introduce the sound and think of any words that begin with the letter sound e.g. sun. Practise oral blending of words by showing objects/pictures e.g. s-u-n. Sort between those that start with the sound and those which don't. Draw s in a variety of sizes on paper, the back of your hand and air writing. Wednesday: Phonics: Recall s using flashcards. Play I Spy with s objects. new sound of the day: 16 Introduce the sound and think of any words that begin with the letter sound e.g. ant. Teach the children the high frequency words a, at, as Practise oral blending of words by showing objects/pictures e.g. a-n+t is ant. Sort between those which start with a and s and distinguish between the two. Thursday: Phonics: Recall s and a using flashcards. Say words starting with a or s phoneme and ask children to show the right letter. new sound of the day: 16 Introduce the sound and think of any words that begin with that letter sound e.g. tin. Phonics: Recall s and a using flashcards. Say words starting with a or s phoneme and ask children to show the right letter. new sound of t	20 Minute s daily
<u>Reading:</u>	Remember to read your reading book with a family member at least 3 times throughout the week. Please ensure that you allow the children to hold the book themselves and encourage them to turn the page as this is part of their learning in reception. Before you even open the book ask the children about what they can see on the front cover. Do they recognise any of the characters? What do they think the story is going to be about? Can they guess the title? Then on each page ask the children what is happening in the pictures and ask them to predict what is going to happen next.	15 minute s daily

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
	With the words the children cannot read them yet but they might be able to recognise some of the	
	sounds they have already learnt about in phonics. If you tell them the words, get them to repeat them	
	and see if they can recognise any repeating words.	
	They may also recognise the high frequency words that they have been taught in phonics this week (a,	
	at and as)	
	Then after finishing the story try re-telling the story to check if your chid has understood what has	
	happened in the story and see If they can remember any characters.

	<u>Tuesday:</u> <u>Learning Objective: To match pictures and words</u>	
	In your learning pack there is a page with lots of pictures of items from a house and the words, get the	
	children to cut out the words (if you do not have appropriate scissors then you can cut them out for	
	them) and then match the words to the pictures. As you can see on the sheet the initial sound is red	
	because this is going to help the children to match it to a picture. For example when looking for the	
	word door ask the children what the first sound is they can hear in door and once they recognise it is d	
	can they find a word beginning with this sound.	
	Wednesday:	
	Learning Objective: To label a house	
	In your learning pack there will be a picture of a house, please get your children to label it. They can	
	use the sound mat provided, ask them what sounds they can hear in the words that they want to	
	write. Remember that they are learning how to write words phonetically so it won't be written how	
	we would write it for example house might be written as hows as these are the only sounds they can hear.	
	Thursday:	
	Learning objective: To talk about a picture	


	In your learning pack there is a copy of the page from 'You Choose' that we will be using for today's	
	learning. Sit down together and look at the page of the book. Talk to the children about which house they would choose and check if there are any houses that they are unsure of what they are e.g. the igloo.	
	Friday: Learning objective: To draw and label a picture Remember yesterday's learning about the page of the book from 'You Choose'. Get the children to	
	draw their perfect house and then label the different features. When labelling ask the children which sounds they can hear in the words that they want to write, even if this is only the initial sound in the word this is ok.	
	Remember this is their perfect house so they can be creative and have anything they want.	
andwriting	This week we are writing the letters we have learnt about in phonics 's' 'a' 't' and 'p'. Use the handwriting sheets provided and take your time practicing the letter formation. Use the rhymes below to help your child to form the letters correctly.	15 minut s ever other
