TUESDAY	Continue to share the nursery rhyme of 'Miss Polly had a dolly' with your child.	01/12/20		
WEDNESDAY	When you sing the rhyme TODAY, try leaving out the last word from each line e.g. 'So she called for the' and pause allowing your child to say the missing word or vocalise.	02/12/20		
THURSDAY	Emphasise some of the words from the song TODAY with your child e.g. 'quick, quick, quick and 'rat-a-tat with your child.	03/12/20		
FRIDAY	Tap out the words 'quick, quick, quick' and 'rat-a-tat' on the table or worktop and encourage your child to copy. You could also use a musical instrument if you have one e.g. drum, tambourine.	04/12/20

<u>FRIDAY</u>	Practise writing 'for a pill, pill, pill' (a prescription for the dolly) like in the song. But TODAY do this outdoors using a twig in some soil or mud.	04/12/20
