Peek at our Half Term...

Maths

What we already know

- To partition numbers into tens and ones (Within 20)
- To compare different lengths and heights.
- To use a ruler to measure.
- To tell the time to o'clock
- To identify and use 2D and 3D shapes.
- Place value within 20

What we are going to learn

- To add and subtract numbers up to using a range of different methods.
- Multiplication focusing on 2's and 10's.
- Measurement Weighing different objects using standard and non-standard unitis.
- Place Value within 50.

Activities you can do at home

Complete your Purple Mash homework weekly.

Practice writing your numbers up to 30 and check that you are forming each letter correctly.

Practice basic addition and subtraction questions at home including number bonds to 10.

Practice 2's, 5's and 10 times tables.

Reading

What we already know

- How to make simple inferences from a text.
- Reading individual phonemes (sounds) and blending them back together.
- How to answer questions and describe characters in a story.
- How to sequence a story I have read.
- How to identify real and fake words.

What we are going to learn

- Continue with phase 3, 4 and 5 sounds and apply these when reading our books.
- Continue practicing our blending skills.
- How to read and perform simple poetry.
- How to use expression when reading a story.

Activities you can do at home

- Complete any Myon / Oxford owl homework set.
- Use the Oxford owl website to access a range of e-books.
- Regularly re-cap phonics phase 3 and phase 4 sounds.
- Compete your phonics home learning set on purple mash weekly.
- Use phonics bug for remote learning.

Writing



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What we already know

- To use a range of adjectives to describe.
- To use bossy (Imperative verbs) (Chop, cut, pour, mix)
- To use time connectives when sequencing or re-telling a story (First, Next, Then, After that)
- To use the conjunctions 'and', 'because.'

What we are going to learn

- To use the plural 'ing'.
- To use prepositional language
- Prefix 'Un'
- Alphabetical order.
- Features of poetry.

Activities you can do at home

*Complete your writing homework weekly

Practice sentence building/ writing with your children daily using a simple word of your choice to start:

e.g start with the word 'Man'.
Put this in a sentence and use an adjective.
'The tall man.'

Now can you add a verb (What is he doing?) 'The tall man is running.

Science

What we already know (Last half term – Seasons)

- To observe and comment on seasonal changes.
- To name the seasons
- To suggest the type of weather in each season.
- To observe how day length varies

What we are going to learn - Animals

- To name a variety of animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles birds and mammals.
- To classify and name animals by what they eat (carnivore, herbivore and omnivore).
- To sort animals into categories (including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals).
- To describe and compare a variety of animals
- To notice animals, and humans, have babies which grow into adults

Activities you can do at home

- Have a look on BBC bite size at the different animal groups.
- Brain storm with your families –
 What animals do you know?
 Create an animal fact file poster
 looking at the different features of
 that animal.

Topic

What we already know (Last half term – Florence Nightingale

- To order the events in Florence Nightingales life.
- To understand the passing of time.
- To begin to use dates.
- To use words and phrases like: old, new and a long time.

What we already What we are going to learn – Africa

- To ask simple geographical questions.
- To name, describe and compare places I know.
- To name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans.
- To explain some of the main things in hot and cold places.

Handwriting

What we already know

- Introducing the basic principles of handwriting.
- Practicing letter formation using a range of different exercise

What we are going to learn

- Continue with basic handwriting non-negotiables.
- Using RWI letter stories to remember letter formation.
- Writing nearly on the line in Literacy and handwriting books.
- Correct formation of capital letters.

Activities you can do at home

- Practice your handwriting regularly.
- Practice your letter formation.
- Practice your pencil grip at home.
